EKC Group is a statutory corporation by virtue of the Further and Higher Education Act 1992. It is an exempt charity under the terms of Schedule 3 of the Charities Act 2011. Consequently, the Group has a commitment to deliver a significant public benefit to the local and wider community that it serves.

In 2017, the Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (OFSTED) judged overall effectiveness to be 'good' with a number of outstanding features, notably in leadership and management, student's personal development, provision for learners with high needs and provision for Adults. The inspection of apprenticeship provision serving Dover Thanet and Shepway was also judged 'Outstanding'.
